# Stay Safe And Secure Online

## Six Golden Security Rules



### 1. Enable Multi-Factor Authentication where you can:

Two-factor Authentication provides an extra layer of protection. This means that after you have entered your username and password, you must provide another piece of unique information to gain access.

### 2. Practice Strong Password Hygiene:

When setting up a password, make sure to choose one that is unique, hard to guess and difficult to crack for hackers.

This is achieved by following general password best practices.

- ◆ picking one that is at least eight characters long,
- ◆ not a commonly used word
- ◆ includes numbers and symbols.
- ◆ Avoid the obvious such as sequential numbers (“1234”) or personal information such as your date of birth or names of family.

‘letmein’ does not follow best password practice.

### 3. Update Your Devices so ensuring your devices are secure:

Out-of-date software , apps and operating systems contain weaknesses that make them easier to be hacked.

### 4. Back Up Your Data:

Backing up regularly will help data recovery quicker in case it gets lost or stolen.

### 5. Be Careful Where You Click, Be Careful What You Download:

A careless click can expose your personal data online or infect your device with malware. It’s essential to browse consciously and avoid certain types of online content such as:

- ◆ links from untrusted sources and spam emails
- ◆ online quizzes
- ◆ clickbait
- ◆ ‘free’ offers
- ◆ unsolicited ads

Emails from an unknown source avoid clicking on any links within it or opening any attachments.

### 6. Use A Good AntiVirus And Keep It Up-To-Date:

It is essential to use a good quality antivirus and keep it up-to-date. Internet security software guards devices/data and blocks common threats like viruses and malware plus complex ones like spy apps.


