




41 Club National Conference 76th Annual General Meeting

Overview from National Councilor Richard Dyson

Despite the stop/start Covid challenges of the past couple of years, seriously delaying Conference, we finally got underway. Duncan Kennedy and his team worked tirelessly to overcome the many challenges.



Much Association business was conducted during the period, making progress for the benefit of the membership. Officers came and went, according to the rules, finances were scrutinised, and future policies were adopted.

Full detail of the Conference will appear in forthcoming newsletters, 41 Club magazines and on the website, but the following detail will serve to summarise the main discussions:

AGM Summary:

- 106 voting delegates were present at the AGM, with a further 39 proxy voters, totalling 145 eligible to vote. In addition, several members were able to access recorded proceedings. This number was greater than in recent years
- The meeting was well conducted, and lasted 5 hours, and yes, the paint did dry!
- Membership stands in excess of 13,000, comparing with Round Table's 3,000
- More than 30 new 41 clubs have been formed in the past 3 years, 7 of which are in Scotland, more on the way, but there have been 9 disaffiliations, most of which are linked with members' advancing years
- Each officer's report was accepted and appears on the web site




